The Fund seeks income exempt from both federal and Colorado state personal income taxes.

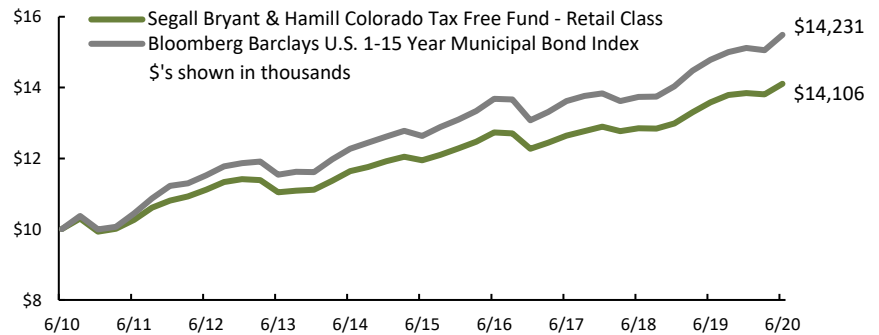
INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY

- We seek to take advantage of inefficiencies in the fixed income market by identifying high-quality, overlooked issues that offer a measurable return advantage.
- We focus on fundamental analysis and disciplined risk controls rather than market timing.
- Our consistent process seeks to perform well in all periods with an emphasis on capital preservation.

KEY FEATURES

- Analyze creditworthiness of each bond through rigorous, proprietary fundamental research.
- Select bonds from many areas of the state to reduce economic risk to the portfolio from any particular local economy.
- From a top-down perspective, manage interest rate risk to control price volatility.
- Able to take meaningful positions in smaller credits that are less efficiently traded.
- Seek to capitalize on large valuation swings in tax-exempt market.

Effective Duration is a measure of price sensitivity resulting from changes in the yield of a bond. **Average Maturity** is the date on which a bond, other debt or security is due to be repaid. **Turnover** is the percentage of a portfolio that is sold in a particular year. **Standard Deviation** is a statistical measure of the historical volatility of a fund. **Tracking Error** is a measure of how closely a fund follows the index to which it is benchmarked. **Upside Capture** is the statistical measure of an investment manager's overall performance in up-markets. **Downside Capture** is a statistical measure of an investment manager's overall performance in down-markets. **Sharpe Ratio** is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of volatility or total risk.

The **Bloomberg Barclays U.S. 1-15 Year Municipal Index** measures the performance of investment grade (Moody's Investor Services Aaa to Baa, Standard and Poor's Corporation AAA to BBB) general obligation and revenue bonds with maturities ranging from 1 to 17 years. It is a broad index that is representative of the tax-exempt bond market. An investor cannot invest directly in an index.

The **Bloomberg Barclays U.S. 10-Year Municipal Index** is an unmanaged index that includes investment grade (Moody's Investor Services Aaa to Baa, Standard & Poor's AAA to BBB) tax-exempt bonds with maturities between eight and twelve years. As of 6/30/20, WICOX (Institutional Class) in the Muni Single State Intern Bond category for the three-year period received 5 stars among 142 funds, for the five-year period received 5 stars among 129 funds and for the 10-year period received 4 stars among 109 funds. The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods.
