INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY

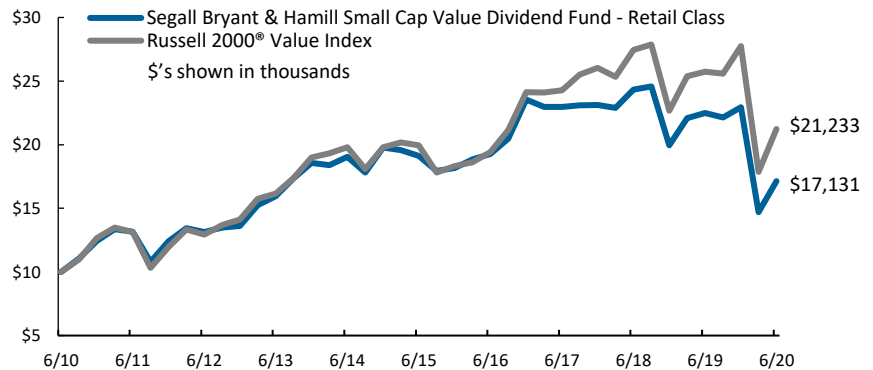
We believe:

- A team decision-making approach provides diverse, in-depth perspectives, bringing the team's best ideas into portfolios.

KEY FEATURES

- Focus on high quality dividend-paying small-cap companies that are trading at discounted valuations.
- Seek to invest in companies generating positive free cash flow and improving returns on capital that have attractive opportunities in which to invest where there is a balance between that investment and returning capital to shareholders in the form of dividends.
- Emphasize strict adherence to our style and risk controls measures.

Weighted Avg. Mkt Cap is the average of the market capitalizations of the companies in the portfolio weighted by the size of each company's position within the portfolio. **Median Market Cap** is the midpoint of market capitalization. **Price/Earnings** is a stock's per share price divided by its per share earnings over a 12-month period. **Active Share** is a measure of the percentage of stock holdings in a manager's portfolio that differs from the benchmark index. **Turnover** is the percentage of a portfolio that is sold in a particular year. **Beta** is a measure of a fund's sensitivity to market movements. **Standard Deviation** is a statistical measure of the historical volatility of a fund. **Tracking Error** is a measure of how closely a fund follows the index to which it is benchmarked. **Upside Capture** is the statistical measure of an investment manager's overall performance in up-markets. **Downside Capture** is a statistical measure of an investment manager's overall performance in down-markets. **Sharpe Ratio** is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of volatility or total risk.

The **Russell 2000® Value Index** is a market-weighted total return index that measures the performance of companies within the Russell 2000 Index having lower price-to-book ratios and lower forecasted growth values than the threshold determined by Frank Russell Company. As of 6/30/20, WISVX (Institutional Class) in the Small Value category for the three-year period received 2 stars among 413 funds, for the five-year period received 3 stars among 373 funds and for the 10-year period received 2 stars among 258 funds. The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods.
