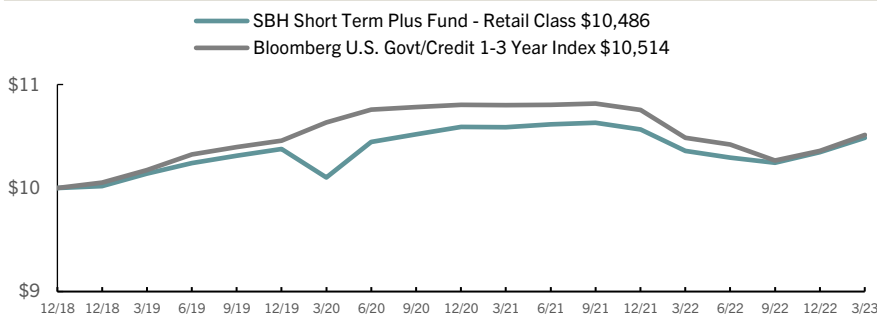
From 5/1/23 until at least 4/30/24, the Adviser has contractually agreed to waive the investment advisory and/or administration fees and/or to reimburse other expenses (not including acquired fund fees and expenses, taxes, brokerage expenses, and extraordinary expenses), so that the ratio of expenses to average net assets as reported in the Fund's Financial Highlights will be no more than 0.49% and 0.40% for the Fund's Retail Class and Institutional Class, respectively, for such period. This agreement may not be terminated or modified by the Adviser prior to 4/30/24, without the approval of the Board of Trustees.

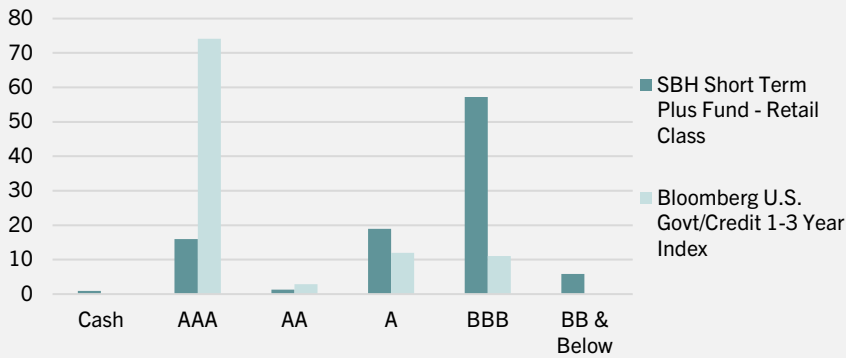

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As of 3/31/23, SBHPX (Retail Class) in the Short Term Bond category for the three-year period received 4 stars among 535 funds. As of 3/31/23, SBAPX (Institutional Class) in the Short Term Bond category for the three-year period received 4 stars among 535 funds. The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods.
